MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the West Islip Union Free School District ("District") and the West Islip Teachers Association ("WITA") are parties to a collective bargaining agreement for the period July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 ("CBA") which provides at Article V.F that teacher replacements hired for more than ninety-two (92) days shall be placed properly on the Teacher's Salary Schedule and receive the benefits under the CBA prospectively; and

WHEREAS, the District has discussed with WITA that there are certain leave replacement positions that are difficult to fill based upon the limited number of available applicants; and

WHEREAS, the District and WITA wish to memorialize an agreement they have reached with respect to salary schedule placement of leave replacements hired to positions that are difficult to fill.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed as follows:

- 1. The District may, for the following leave replacement positions, waive the 92-day waiting period as referenced in Article V.F of the CBA and place a leave replacement teacher effective with the first day of employment properly on the Teacher's Salary Schedule of the CBA:
 - World Language Teachers
 - Earth Science
 - Physics
 - Chemistry
 - Technology
 - Family and Consumer Science
 - Such other positions as the District determines, after consultation with the Union, are difficult to fill.
- 2. For any leave replacement teacher for whom the 92-day waiting period is waived as set forth in Paragraph 1 above, such waiver shall be solely with respect to salary placement, so that all other benefits of the CBA will be prospective beginning after 92 days.
- 3. Except as specifically set forth herein, this Agreement shall not be construed as modifying the CBA or any practices which may exist as between the District and WITA.
- 4. This Agreement shall not be precedent setting and shall not be utilized by any party in any grievance, arbitration or claim of any kind except as necessary to enforce its terms.

SEQRA RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the West Islip Union Free School District desires to embark upon the following capital improvements at the District's facilities as set forth herein and as listed in the working budget: (1) construction of a new security vestibule at the administration entrance located at the Beach Street Middle School; (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, said capital improvements are subject to classification under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and

WHEREAS, construction or expansion of a primary or accessory/appurtenant, nonresidential structure or facility involving less than 4,000square feet of gross floor area and not involving a change in zoning or a use variance and consistent with local land use controls, but not radio communication or microwave transmission facilities are classified as Type II Actions under the current Department of Environmental Conservation SEQR Regulations (Section 6 NYCRR 617.5 (c)(9)); and

WHEREAS, routine activities of educational institutions, including expansion of existing facilities by less than 10,000 square feet of gross floor area are classified as Type II Actions under the current Department of Environmental Conservation SEQR Regulations (Section 6 NYCRR 617.5 (c)(10)); and

WHEREAS, the purchase or sale of furnishings, equipment or supplies...other than the following: land, radioactive material, pesticides, herbicides, or other hazardous materials are classified as Type II Actions under the current Department of Environmental Conservation SEQR Regulations (Section 6 NYCRR 617.5 (c)(31)); and

WHEREAS, the SEQR Regulations declare Type II Actions to be actions that have no significant impact on the environment and require no further review under SEQR; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, as the only involved agency, has examined all information related to the capital improvement projects and has determined that the Projects are classified as Type II Actions pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(9),(10), and (31) of the SEQR Regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby declares itself lead agency in connection with the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby declares that the Projects are Type II Actions, which require no further review under SEQR; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby shall forward an official copy of this Resolution to the New York State Education Department together with a copy of the correspondence from the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation in connection with its request for approval of the listed Projects from the New York State Education Department.
