RESOLUTION OF THE WEST ISLIP UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, NEW YORK, ADOPTED NOVEMBER 14, 2023, CALLING A SPECIAL DISTRICT MEETING TO AUTHORIZE THE EXPENDITURE OF MONEYS FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES AND THE LEVY OF A TAX THEREFOR.

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE WEST ISLIP UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A Special District Meeting of the qualified voters of the West Islip Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), shall be held within the District, on Tuesday, January 23, 2024, at 7:00 o'clock A.M. (Prevailing Time) at the West Islip High School, 1 Lions Path, West Islip, New York; as provided in the Notice calling said Special District Meeting as hereinafter substantially prescribed. The voting at such Special District Meeting shall be by voting machine or paper ballot, as provided by the Education Law, and the polls shall remain open from 7:00 o'clock A.M. to 9:00 o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time) on said day and as much longer as may be necessary to enable the voters, then present, to cast their votes.

Section 2. The business to be acted upon at said Special District Meeting shall be as stated in the Notice thereof, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause the Notice of said Special District Meeting to be published in the "Babylon Beacon" and "Islip Bulletin," two newspapers having a general circulation in the District, such publications to be made four (4) times within the seven (7) weeks next preceding such Special District Meeting, the first publications to be at least forty-five (45) days prior to the date of said Special District Meeting.

Section 3. Said Notice of Special District Meeting shall be substantially in the following

form:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Board of Education of the West Islip Union Free School District, Town of Islip, Suffolk County in the County of Suffolk, New York, adopted a resolution on November 14, 2023, authorizing a Special District Meeting of the qualified voters of said School District to be held on Tuesday January 23, 2024, at the West Islip High School, 1 Lions Path, West Islip, New York, 11795, between the hours of 7:00 am and 9:00pm, prevailing time, at which time the polls will be opened to vote by paper ballot upon the following Bond Proposition:

- (a) That the Board of Education of the West Islip Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to expand the existing 5-lane indoor pool to a new 6-lane pool, including all mechanical, electrical, plumbing, and construction requirements, at the West Islip High School, substantially as described in a report prepared for the District by BBS Architects, Landscape Architects & Engineers, P.C., which report is on file and available for public inspection at the office of the District Clerk, the foregoing is to include the original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus and ancillary or related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith; and to expend therefor, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated maximum cost of \$13,850,574;
- (b) that a tax is hereby voted in the aggregate amount not to exceed \$13,850,574 to pay such cost, said tax is to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as shall be determined by said Board of Education; and
- (c) that in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the District are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$13,850,574 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

Such Bond Proposition shall appear on the ballot used for voting at said Special District Meeting in substantially the following condensed form:

RESOLVED:

(a) That the Board of Education of the West Islip Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to expand the existing 5-lane indoor pool to a new 6-lane pool, substantially as described in a report prepared for the District by BBS Architects, Landscape Architects & Engineers, P.C., and to expend therefor, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated maximum cost of \$13,850,574; (b) that a tax is hereby voted in the aggregate amount of not to exceed \$13,850,574 to pay such cost, said tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as shall be determined by said Board of Education; and (c) that in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the District are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of not to exceed \$13,850,574 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that personal registration of voters is required either pursuant to Section 2014 of the Education Law, or pursuant to Article 5 of the Election Law. If a voter has heretofore registered pursuant to Section 2014 of the Education Law and has voted at an annual or special district meeting within the last four (4) calendar years, he or she is eligible to vote at this Special District Meeting. If a voter is registered and eligible to vote under Article 5 of the Election Law, he or she is also eligible to vote at this Special District Meeting. All other persons who wish to vote must register.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, the voters may register with the Clerk of said School District at her office in the District Administration Office, 100 Sherman Avenue, West Islip, New York 11795, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.M. to 4:00 o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time) when school is in session at any day prior to January 18, 2024 to add any additional names to the Register to be used at the aforesaid Special District Meeting, at which time any person will be entitled to have his or her name placed on such Register provided that at such meeting with the Clerk of said School District he or she is known or proven to the satisfaction of the Clerk of said School District to be then or thereafter entitled to vote at such Special District Meeting for which the Register is prepared. The Register so prepared pursuant to Section 2014 of the Education Law will be filed in the Office of the District Clerk, at her office in the District Administration Office, 100 Sherman Avenue, West Islip, New York 11795, and will be open for inspection by any qualified voter of the District beginning on and after Thursday, January 18, 2024, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.M. to 4:00 o'clock P.M., (Prevailing Time), on Saturday, January 20, 2024 by prearranged appointment only between the hours of 10:00 o'clock A.M. and 1:30 P.M. (Prevailing Time), and on January 23, 2024, the day set for the Special District Meeting except Sunday, and at the polling place(s) on the day of the vote.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that applications for absentee ballots are obtainable at: www.wi.k12.ny.us and will be obtainable during school business hours from the District Clerk beginning Tuesday, January 2, 2024; completed applications must be received by the District Clerk no earlier than December 26, 2023. For in-person applications, applications must be received by the District Clerk no earlier than January 2, 2024, at least seven (7) days before the Special District Meeting, January 16, 2024, if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the Special District Meeting, January 22, 2024, if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk not later than 5:00 o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time) on Tuesday, January 23, 2024.

A list of persons to whom absentee ballots are issued will be available for inspection to qualified voters of the District in the Office of the District Clerk on and after Thursday, January 18, 2024, on each day prior to the day set for the Special District Meeting, except Sunday, on Mondays through Fridays between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.M. and 4:00 o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time), on Saturday, January 20, 2024 by prior appointment only between the hours of 10:00 o'clock A.M. and 1:30 P.M. (Prevailing Time), and at the polling place on January 23, 2024, the day set for the Special District Meeting. Any qualified voter then present in the polling place may object to the voting of the ballot upon appropriate grounds by making his or her challenge and the reasons therefore known to the Inspector of Election before the close of the polls.

Ballots for military voters shall be distributed to qualified military voters no later than December 22, 2023. Military ballots must be received by the District Clerk (1) before the close of the polls, on Tuesday, January 23, 2024, and must show a cancellation mark of the United States postal service or a foreign country's postal service, or must show a dated endorsement of receipt by another agency of the United States Government, or are signed and dated by the voter and one witness thereto with a date which is ascertained to be not later than the day before the election, January 22, 2024 and which must be received in the office of the clerk of the school district not later than 5:00 o'clock P.M. on the day of

the election in order to be canvassed.

SUBJECT: HEALTH EXAMINATIONS

The Board reserves the right to request a health examination at any time during employment, at School District expense, in order to determine the physical and mental capacity of an employee to perform his/her duties.

Support staff personnel initially appointed to positions may be requested to obtain physical examinations at the expense of the School District. The physical examination is to be obtained from the school physician or the potential employee's private physician.

All members of the Food Service staff shall have a physical examination within thirty (30) days of the start of employment, which may be conducted by a school physician or the employee's private physician.

All bus drivers and substitute bus drivers shall have regular physical examinations as prescribed by the Section 19A Regulations.

Annual or more frequent examinations of any employee may be required, when, in the judgment of the school physician and the Superintendent, such procedure is deemed necessary.

The final acceptance or rejection of a medical report with reference to the health of an employee lies within the discretion of the Board. The decision of the physician designated by the Board as the determining physician shall take precedence over all other medical advice.

Tuberculosis Surveillance for Food Service Workers:

- a) Skin testing or blood testing for tuberculosis will be required as part of the pre-employment physical.
- b) All tuberculin reactors will be referred to the Suffolk County Department of Health Services for evaluation and management. Only positive reactors will be followed and require revaluation as per Suffolk County Department of Health Services and CDC guidelines re evaluated annually.
- c) Tuberculin reactors who have not taken, or do not choose to take, preventive therapy for one year, should be X rayed annually for five years and every two years thereafter.

SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES CONTRACT

This Agreement is entered into this <u>1st</u> day of **September**, 2023 by and between the Board of Education of the **West Islip UFSD** (hereinafter the "**DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE**"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 100 Sherman Ave., West Islip, NY 11795, and the Board of Education of the **Half Hollow Hills Central School District** (hereinafter the "**DISTRICT OF LOCATION**"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 525 **Half Hollow Road**, **Dix Hills**, **NY 11746**.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT OF LOCATION is required by Education Law Section 3602-c to provide special education services to parentally-placed students with disabilities, when such students attend private schools in the DISTRICT OF LOCATION, but reside in the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE; and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT OF LOCATION is a public school district within the State of New York authorized to provide special education and related services to students with disabilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree as follows:

A. <u>TERM</u>: The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 inclusive, unless terminated earlier as provided for in this Agreement.

B. **SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

1. The DISTRICT OF LOCATION shall develop an individualized education service program (IESP) for those student(s) listed on the attached "Confidential Schedule A," incorporated by reference herein and made a part of this Agreement, and shall provide the services set forth in such IESP.

A student(s) and/or services may be added or deleted from the attached Schedule "A" at any time upon written notification to the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE. Such written notification shall include a copy of any revised IESP. In such event, the payment amount owed by the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE shall be adjusted accordingly.

2. The DISTRICT OF LOCATION represents and warrants that services to students under this Agreement shall be provided by individuals who are certified or licensed in accordance with applicable law, rules and regulations.

C. COMPENSATION:

1. The parties to this Agreement recognize that the authority for the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE and the DISTRICT OF LOCATION to contract for the provision of special education services herein is derived from Education Law Section

- 3602-c, and related provisions of the Education Law and Regulations of the Commissioner of Education; and that these statutes and regulations may define the maximum costs that may be charged hereunder.
- 2. The DISTRICT OF LOCATION shall be entitled to bill the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE for the services provided the students listed in Schedule "A" pursuant to this Agreement and the IESP in accordance with Education Law Section 3602-c and the Regulations or Rules of the Commissioner of Education.
- 3. Requests for payment by the DISTRICT OF LOCATION shall be made by submission of a detailed written invoice to the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE on a monthly basis which references the time period for which payment is being requested, and a breakdown of the total amount due for the period specified.
- 4. The DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE shall pay the DISTRICT OF LOCATION within forty-five (45) business days of receipt of each invoice by the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE, unless the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE sends the DISTRICT OF LOCATION a written notice disputing the invoice within forty-five (45) business days of its receipt. If a dispute arises, the parties shall have those legal rights and remedies provided by law and regulation.

D. <u>TERMINATION</u>.

This Agreement may be terminated by written notice of either party if (1) Schedule "A" has been deleted so that there are no students of the DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE entitled to special education services from the DISTRICT OF LOCATION, or (2) the State Education Department has issued guidelines to school districts governing the provision of special education services pursuant to Education Law 3602-c.

E. MISCELLANEOUS

1. All notices which are required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been given if delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, addressed as follows:

To **DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE**: West Islip UFSD

To DISTRICT OF LOCATION: Half

Half Hollow Hills CSD 525 Half Hollow Road Dix Hills, NY 11746

- 2. It is expressly understood that this Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred without prior written consent of the other party.
- 3. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce every provision of this Agreement.
- 4. Should any provision of this Agreement for any reason, be declared invalid and/or unenforceable such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. Such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid provision(s) eliminated.
- 5. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws and regulations of the State of New York and applicable Federal laws and regulations.
- 6. This Agreement, along with the attached Schedule "A", is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: agreements, proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement
- 7. Except for Schedule "A", this Agreement may not be changed orally, but only by an agreement, in writing, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- 8. It is expressly understood that nothing in this Agreement is intended to modify or vary the statutory and regulatory obligations or rights of the parties; nor is it intended to create any additional legal rights or obligations other than those imposed or provided by Federal or State law or regulation.
- 9. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to bestow any benefits or rights to any third parties who are not signatories to this Agreement. The parties to this Agreement shall have the sole right to enforce its terms.
- 10. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to place an obligation on the parties to ensure that the other is complying with its obligations under Federal or State law or regulation.

SEDCAR AGREEMENT 2023-2024

Avenue, New York, 11795, hereinafter referred to as "the District" and Mid Island Therapy Associates, d/b/a All About Kids, 255 Executive Drive, LL 105, Plainview, NY 11803 hereinafter referred to as the "Provider";

WHEREAS, The District is the Local Education Agency (LEA) for the purposes of receiving federal IDEA flow-through funds from the New York State Education Department for Part B, Section 611 (P.L. 94-142 for students with disabilities ages 3-21) and Section 619 (P.L. 99-457 for students with disabilities ages 3-5) and suballocating such funds to approved special education programs (ASEPs) for certain students with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Provider is an eligible approved special education program authorized to provide special education services to preschool and/or school-aged special education students; and

WHEREAS, the District is authorized to contract with the Provider to provide special education program for preschool and/or school-aged students with educational disabilities who reside within the District and who are placed in such program for the provision of special education services.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree as follows:

- 1. The term of this Agreement shall be for the school year beginning between July 1, 2023 June 30, 2024. Payment of the sub-allocation of such funds to the Provider shall be made on a per student basis.
- 2. In order to receive payment for the services rendered under this Agreement, the Provider must complete all required forms. The Provider shall complete the SEDCAR-1 Form. A fully completed copy will be made a part of this Agreement as Attachment A. The Provider will receive payment from the District based on the total number of students as indicated on the SEDCAR-1 and subject to verification.
- 3. The SEDCAR-1 Form must be completed and received by the District no later than November 25, 2022. The FS 25 and an invoice with the total amount due must by received by the District no later than June 1, 2024. The FS 10F shall be completed by the Provider and submitted to the District no later than sixty (60) days after the close of the Provider's grant year. Upon receipt of the required forms, the District shall process payment of funds to the Provider.

All forms and notices that shall be given to the District shall be sent to the Board at the following address:

- 100 Sherman Avenue, West Islip, NY 11795
- 4. The District shall process payments to the Provider in accordance with applicable laws. The Board is only obligated to process payments to the Provider for the

provision of services in the approved program as permitted under IDEA. Payments made to the Provider pursuant to this Agreement shall be utilized only for the purpose as provided in IDEA.

- 5. The Provider shall maintain their books, records and accounts pertaining to the use of these funds in accordance with the requirements of the Reimbursable Cost Manual. The District, SED and the State Comptroller, or their authorized representative(s) shall have the right to conduct a fiscal audit of the Project supported by these funds, provided, however, that nothing in this Agreement will diminish or modify the audit procedures required in any other contract which the Provider may have with the District for the provision of special education or other services. Access to property and personnel related to the Provider's use of these funds shall be provided during an audit.
- 6. If, upon audit of this Agreement, the District determines that funds were used for unapproved uses, said funds shall be returned to the District upon request.
- 7. Except as otherwise directed by the District, the Provider shall, until six (6) years after the end of the term of the Agreement, or until six (6) years after the termination of the Agreement, retain all books and records required hereunder, including, without limitation, all cost and accounting records, employee certifications, staff (pedagogical and non-pedagogical) attendance, service and time records pertaining to the use of these funds. The Provider shall make all books and records available to the District, the SED, the State Comptroller, or their authorized representatives, for review and audit at such times during business hours as they may request.
- 8. The Provider shall furnish any additional data and reports, including, but not limited to SED submissions, as the District deems to be related to the performance of the Agreement, upon request of the District. The Provider shall be given a reasonable time to respond to such requests.
- 9. The Provider shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws in connection with the services to be provided by the Provider under this Agreement.
- 10. The District and the Provider may agree that if state law or regulation is amended during the term of this Agreement to provide for the flow-through to the Provider of funds from prior years known as "carryover funds", this Agreement may also pertain to the distribution of those funds in accordance with the requirements of the law or regulation.
- 11. The District reserves the right to amend this Agreement, as may be necessary, in order to comply with any change in applicable law, regulations and guidelines governing the operation of this Agreement.
- 12. This Agreement may only be modified or amended by mutual agreement of the parties, in writing.

13. Provider agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the District, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuit costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the Provider, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. It is intended that this provision be interpreted in the broadest manner possible so as to insulate the District from any liability or judgment, monetary or otherwise, as the same may relate to the personnel and services provided by the Provider to the District pursuant to this Agreement (but not for the willful or negligent acts or omissions of the District, its officers, employees and agents).

District agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Provider, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuit costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the District, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. It is intended that this provision be interpreted in the broadest manner possible so as to insulate the Provider from any liability or judgment, monetary or otherwise, as the same may relate to the personnel and services provided by the District to the Provider pursuant to this Agreement (but not for the willful or negligent acts or omissions of the Provider, its officers, employees and agents).

14. The Provider agrees to indemnify and save harmless the District, its officers, employees and agents, against any all claims, liabilities, loss, damages, suit, proceeding, costs or expenses whatsoever, including those personal injuries and property damage, as they may relate, in any manner, to the services provided by the Agency to the District pursuant to this Agreement. Said indemnification, defense and hold harmless shall apply to any claim, liability, loss, damages, suit proceeding, costs or expenses in which the District, its officers, employees and agents may be named as a party (except for willful or negligent acts and omissions of the District), notwithstanding that the Provider may deem said claim, liability, loss, damages, suit, proceeding costs or expenses frivolous or without merit. It is intended that this provision be interpreted in the broadest manner possible so as to insulate the District from any liability or judgement, monetary or otherwise, as the same may relate to the personnel and services provided by the Agency the District pursuant to this Agreement (but not for the willful or negligent acts or omissions of the District, its officers, employees and agents).

The District agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Provider, its officers employees and agents, against any and all claims, liabilities, loss damages, suit, proceeding, costs or expenses whatsoever, including those personal injuries and property damage, as they may relate in any manner to the services provided by the Provider, its officers, employees and agents may be named as a party {except for willful or negligent acts and omissions of the Provider), notwithstanding that the District may seem said claim, liability, loss, damages, suit, proceeding costs or expenses frivolous or without merit. It is intended that this provision be interpreted in the broadest manner possible so as to insulate the Provider from any

liability or judgement, monetary or otherwise, as the same may relate to the personnel and services provided by the Provider to the District pursuant to this Agreement {but not willful or negligent acts or omissions of the Provider, its officers, employees and agents}.

15. The Provider agrees that it will not discriminate with respect to the provision of special education services on the grounds of race, religion creed, color, national origin, sex, age, disability or other non-merit factors, nor discriminate against any individual on such ground.
